Wishing all a Happy Holiday and a warm merry winter season unlike the winter at Valley Forge many years ago. Though several locations were proposed, Washington selected <u>Valley Forge, Pennsylvania</u>, 20 miles (30 km) northwest of <u>Philadelphia</u>. Named for an <u>iron forge</u> on Valley Creek, the area was close enough to the British to keep their raiding and foraging parties out of the interior of Pennsylvania, yet far enough away to halt the threat of British surprise attacks. The densely forested plateau of Mount Joy and the adjoining two-mile-long (3 km) plateau of Mount Misery combined with the <u>Schuylkill River</u> to the north, made the area easily defensible, along with providing abundant forests of timber that would later be used to construct the thousands of log huts. Seventy-eight of the huts in the camp would house the soldiers, **but over 2,500 of those soldiers died**.^[1]
