

Member Spotlight



James Lochary

November 10, 1930 - September 19, 2025

James Henry Lochary, 93, of Amesville passed away Friday, September 19, 2025 at The Laurels of Athens where he had been residing since May 2024. He was born on November 10, 1930 in Gallipolis, the son of the late Patrick Lochary and Clara Eleanor Henry Lochary of Pomeroy.

He was a graduate of Pomeroy High School and Ohio University. He was a U.S. Air Force veteran serving in Greenland and Tyndall Air Force Base in Florida. He was honorably discharged in July 1954 as a First Lieutenant. He married Ruth McCurdy in 1954 and they had four children, Susan, James, Jr., Patricia and William "Chris".

Jim was employed as a school administrator at various schools in Ohio and Indiana. He was a representative of John Wiley and Sons in the sale of college textbooks until retirement. After retirement he moved to Centerville, Ohio with Ruth, then moved to Amesville to live on the family farm in 1998. The Henry Farm of Amesville was inherited thru his uncle Harry Glen Henry and his mother, Clara Eleanor Henry. The farm was founded in 1816 by John Henry. Jim was the sixth generation to live on the farm.


He was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution (Ewings Chapter), Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (John S. Townsend 108) and Amesville Grange 798. He was a member and Past Master of Amesville Lodge 278 F&AM and a member of the Athens York Rite Masonic Bodies. He was also a lifetime member of the Clan MacBean of North America. Jim is survived by his daughter, Patricia Polizzi (Tommy) of Scranton, PA; his grandson Shane Leep (Christina) and his great-grandson, Declan Leep of Circleville; his son, William "Christopher" Lochary of Lancaster; his son in law, Steven Garguillo who lives on the Henry Farm in Amesville; a brother, Charles Lochary of Mathews, NC; a nephew, Robert Lochary of Golden, CO; and a niece Dr. Margaret Lochary of Mathews, NC.

Besides his parents he is preceded in death by his wife, Ruth McCurdy Lochary, who died in 2010; a son, James Lochary, Jr., who died in 2019; and a daughter, Susan Rebbecca Lochary Garguillo, who died the day after Christmas in 2020.

A graveside service will be conducted Wednesday, September 24, 2025 at 12:00 noon at Beechgrove Cemetery, Pomeroy with Steve Hays officiating. 

For The Bookshelf

A comprehensive look at how French colonial troops in New France adapted their clothing, arms, and tactics for wilderness warfare between 1683 and 1760.



Frontier Soldiers of New France Volume 2 explores the evolution of the French colonial troops' campaign attire and equipment adapted for North America's demanding climate and terrain, integrating European military methods with practical adjustments for wilderness warfare. It focuses on the material culture of the Compagnies franches de la Marine in New France from 1683 to 1760, examining their specific campaign clothing, arms, and equipment. The study highlights their adaptation to the local environment and interactions with Native American cultures, including the adoption of items such as breechcloths, leggings, toboggans, snowshoes, moccasins, scalping knives and tomahawks.

The survival of New France owed much to a strategic doctrine of raiding warfare developed by Canadian colonial officers in collaboration with allied Native American tribes and the colonial militia. This groundbreaking study provides the first comprehensive survey detailing the clothing, weaponry, and equipment used by the stationed troops from 1683 to 1760 to maintain defensive pressure on New Englanders and engage hostile Native American tribes in warfare. Drawing on groundbreaking research based on archaeology, existing artifacts, and newly discovered records, this volume highlights their exceptional ability to adapt to North American conditions, including both winter and summer wilderness campaigns.
